


MISSION

The College strives to shape responsible global citizens and future leaders, nurtured by the intellectual heritage and liberal educational values of Greece and the United States.

SCHOOLS

The Hellenic-American Educational Foundation (HAEF) is the umbrella institution for "J.M. Carras" Kindergarten and two highly competitive sister schools, Athens College and Psychico College. Each has an elementary school, a junior high school, and a high school. Students can enroll in the schools in Grade 1 directly from the Kindergarten or through a lottery system. Competitive entrance examinations for a limited number of places are offered for Grades 2-11.

The number of need-based and merit scholarship recipients in 2023-2024 was **551**, with a total value of **€4,156,689**



CURRICULUM

Students following the Greek National Curriculum are awarded the Greek High School Certificate ("Apolytirion" of the Genikon Lykeion) at the end of Grade 12. Students in this program take advanced courses in one of four areas of concentration: Humanities, Math and Science, Health Sciences, or Economics and Computer Science. In Grades 9-12 the minimum passing grade is 10/20. The final grade for each subject is the average of the two semester grades (50%) and the final exam (50%). The "Apolytirion" average is based on the grade point average of Grade 12 subjects.

The IB DP program offered by Psychico College is one of the most extensive and wellregarded in Europe with students consistently surpassing world grade averages. IB DP students take an additional component in Greek, comprised of three courses (History, Modern Greek Language & Literature, and Physical Education) and are awarded the full equivalent of the Greek "Apolytirion" along with the IB Diploma.



FACILITIES & LOCATION

The Kindergarten, Junior High and High Schools are located on a 37-acre campus in Psychico, about four miles from central Athens. Facilities include:

- 12 academic buildings housing 230 classrooms and labs
- Main Library: 100,000+ volumes in Greek and English; 144 computers; Research Skills and Information Literacy Lab
- Informatics Center (IC): 200-capacity auditorium, with Multimedia Labs, state-ofthe-art 3D printing, milling machine, laser cutter equipment, music technology, and robotics infrastructure
- Athletics Facilities: Indoor Olympic-sized pool; track and field facilities; tennis courts: indoor & outdoor basketball courts
- 810-seat capacity theater hosting educational and cultural events

The academic and athletic facilities of the Elementary Schools are located on a 46acre campus, ten miles northeast of Athens in Kantza.

ATHLETICS & CLUBS

In addition to the Physical Education program which is part of the Greek National Curriculum, the College teams participate in regional and national tournaments. The "A" Association (since 1937), is the inter-school athletic club of Athens College - Psychico College whose purpose is to encourage and advance fair play and good sportsmanship among students. Criteria for admission include: previous athletic distinctions, the candidate's strong academic performance, ethos, and espousal of the principals mentioned above.

A wide range of clubs and extracurricular activities are available to students, with Forensics, Model United Nations, UNESCO, CERN Club, and the Drama Club among the most selective. Students may also choose to write for the school's many Greek, English, French and German publications. The senior class publishes the School Yearbook ("Thisavros"). Students in Grades 10-12 participate in rhetorical and speech writing contests in Greek and English which are among the school's most prestigious events.

COMMUNITY SERVICE & OUTREACH







The College places heavy emphasis on community service and outreach. Each year our students collaborate with over 100 local and international non-governmental organizations (NGOs), such as the Make-a-Wish Foundation, the Greek Red Cross, the World Wildlife Fund (WWF), and refugee-support organizations. An annual three-day school fair ("Panigyri") is the culminating event of the various school activities with presentations by clubs, fundraising events, musical and theatrical performances attended by the school and the Athenian community.



MATRICULATING STUDENTS AND TERTIARY EDUCATION

High school students wishing to pursue tertiary education in Greek universities have to sit highly competitive national examinations ("Pan-Hellenic Exams") in four subjects depending on their chosen field of study. Of the students who completed the Greek National Curriculum, 98.6% were admitted to tertiary Greek public institutions. National Curriculum graduates also applied and were admitted to universities abroad, primarily in the UK, US, Canada, and Europe, or private institutions in Greece. Of the students who completed the IB Diploma Program, 97% were admitted to higher education institutions in the UK, US, Canada, and various European countries.
